Parent feedback: Did NWEA take into account the loss of instruction that happened during SIP? Mr. Alcaraz responded that yes, this was taken into account and the bands were adjusted for this. When you receive a call from the school announcing the start of NWEA, we encourage parents to talk to their student about the seriousness of this assessment. We want to see kids take this seriously so that we can see what they are capable of doing.

Parent: is this data of all grades or is it grade specific? Yes , this is all three grade levels. We do have segregated data for individual grades and we are more than glad to share this with you.

Student Attendance

- 6th Grade 96.03%
- 7th Grade 95.44%
- 8th Grade 97.05%- 8th grade met the 97% goal
- 95.49% total

Overall we did not meet our 97% goal for quarter 1. Our attendance incentive program will begin Q2 with the celebration of Q1 perfect attendance. We will be celebrating 69 students who have a perfect attendance on Oct. 23. If your student is being acknowledged for their perfect attendance you will be receiving a call from the admin inviting the students to join us to our "Ice cream for Perfect Attendance" event.

Parent feedback: Jennifer Mendoza, concerned about losing connectivity and this impacting attendance. Parent Adriana Cruz-Amaya also stated that his daughter is having issues with their wifi. It is important to have students check in with their teacher to let them know. Parent shared that when this happens he immediately calls the main office to let them know about this.

We will continue to monitor attendance and will be sharing this data at our next meeting. We will be starting our attendance incentives to help improve our attendance rates.
